Homeschool Groups

The mission of Moms in Prayer International, an interdenominational prayer ministry previously named Moms In Touch, is to impact children and schools worldwide for Christ by gathering mothers to pray regularly (weekly is optimal). Homeschool moms are in a unique situation of being both teacher and mom. A Homeschool Group is two or more mothers who homeschool their children and meet together to pray not only for the needs of their children, but for themselves as the teachers.

To begin

- Read the *Booklet* thoroughly and become familiar with the Four Steps of Prayer and One Accord Praying.
- Agree with the Moms in Prayer Statement of Faith in the *Booklet* (also online under About Us).
- Become familiar with the Core Values of Moms in Prayer International online under About Us.
- Abide by Moms in Prayer Policies in the *Booklet* (also online under About Us).
- Ask God for at least one other woman with whom you can pray.
- Choose a place and time convenient for you to meet.
- Register as a Homeschool Group at www.MomsInPrayer.org: include the leader's name, information and the school(s) being prayed for. To receive Moms in Prayer emails, please add email@MomsInPrayer.org to your email address book.
- Encourage your members to go online and register as a member, or with their permission you may register them as members on their behalf.

Helpful suggestions

The Prayer Sheet is a valuable tool to use during the time of prayer. Partially filled-in Prayer Sheets are available under Leaders Corner at www.MomsInPrayer.org. During the intercession time, please consider the following:

- Have each member choose one child to pray for that week.
- Pray for yourselves as the teachers.
- Divide into smaller groups of twos or threes if the size of the group allows.

Pray about possible meeting times and locations

- Each participating mom could take a turn watching all the children at a separate location.
- Arrange with a local church to use their facility once a week.
- A Moms in Prayer group from a local school might be willing to work out an exchange of childcare.
- Some homeschools meet together on a weekly basis for a co-op. Consider meeting with the mothers to pray during this time.
- Homeschooled teenagers or a grandmother might be willing to watch the younger children.
