To begin

- Read the *Booklet* thoroughly and become familiar with the Four Steps of Prayer and One Accord Praying.
- Agree with the Moms in Prayer Statement of Faith in the *Booklet* (also online under About Us).
- Become familiar with the Core Values of Moms in Prayer International online under About Us.
- Abide by Moms in Prayer Policies in the *Booklet* (also online under About Us).
- Ask God for at least one other woman with whom you can pray.
- Choose a place and time convenient for you to meet.
- Register as a Working Moms Group at www.MomsInPrayer.org: include the leader's name, information and the school(s) being prayed for. To receive Moms in Prayer emails, please add email@MomsInPrayer.org to your email address book.
- Encourage your members to go online and register as a member, or with their permission you may register them as members on their behalf.

Helpful suggestions

- Have each member choose one child to pray for that week.
- Pray for that child's school.
