



## MOMS IN TOUCH INTERNATIONAL School - Specific Groups

The mission of Moms In Touch International, an interdenominational prayer ministry, is to impact children and schools worldwide for Christ by gathering mothers to pray regularly (weekly is optimal). The specific school group typically meets in a home. Some may choose to meet at another public place such as a church or park, etc.; however, no groups may meet on a school campus with the exception of those who have permission to meet on a Christian school campus.

### To Begin

- Read the MITI Booklet thoroughly and become familiar with the Four Steps of Prayer and One Accord Praying.
- Agree with the MITI Statement of Faith (MITI Booklet).
- Become familiar with the Core Values of Moms In Touch (MITI website, About Us).
- Abide by MITI Policies (MITI Booklet).
- Ask God for at least one other mother with whom you can pray.
- Choose a place and time that are convenient for you to meet.
- Register the group at [www.MomsInTouch.org](http://www.MomsInTouch.org): include the leader's name and, with permission, all members as well.

### Helpful Suggestions

- A prayer sheet is a valuable tool to use during the time of prayer. Filled-in prayer sheets are available at [www.MomsInTouch.org](http://www.MomsInTouch.org), under the Leaders Corner.
- During the intercession time, please consider the following:
  - Have each member choose one child to pray for that week.
  - You may also want to obtain a list of the names of all the students in the school so that each child can be prayed for by name.
  - Divide into smaller groups of twos or threes if the size of the group allows.
- Prayer for a public/private school is praying **for** the school, not **in** the school (Exception: Christian school groups).
- To accommodate women's schedules, there may be multiple MITI groups for the same school.
- A praying mom who has not found another mom to join her yet, or a mom whose children lives in another locality may join a group even though her child does not attend that specific school until such time as a she finds another mom.
- A teacher may join a school-specific group if her own child attends that school or start a group for the faculty of that school.
- If praying for a Christian school, consider (if given permission),
  - meeting at the school to pray.
  - publicizing in school newsletter, at open house, keeping brochures in office.
  - informing the principals/teachers that your group will be praying for them, asking if there is anything specific they would like prayed for and/or placing a prayer request box in the teacher's lounge (be sure to remind teachers not to use students' names for the sake of confidentiality).
